Aims and Learning Objectives:

This will be a case-based discussion of four common pain conditions in which the pain is augmented and perpetuated by hyperalgesic syndromes. Clinical diagnosis, basic science, treatment, with group discussion. This will be co-presented by Dr. Eldon Tunks and Dr. Kevin Rod.

In problematic pain, there is always one or more “mechanisms of pain” and “comorbidities”. What is important and challenging is that the primary pain nociceptive event often is augmented by development of hyperalgesic mechanisms, resulting in clinical pain experience that is enormously more complex and severe and widespread than would be suggested by the initial injury. The mechanisms of secondary and centralized hyperalgesia are being increasingly understood. Ideally, pain relief and pain syndrome management should make use of what we know about secondary hyperalgesia and central hyperalgesia. When this insight is combined with a multidisciplinary perspective we have the best opportunity to effectively manage pain problems that in the past were intractable. We will consider three clinical scenarios that illustrate this relationship of pain mechanisms. Comorbidities, and functional impairments, and the appropriate management; Post-Guillain-Barre syndrome with chronic widespread pain, Opioid-induced hyperalgesia in two elderly patients, Complex Regional Pain Syndrome.

After participating in this event, clinicians will be better able to assess complex and chronic pain problems, identify when hyperalgesia is present, match the appropriate treatment to the appropriate mechanisms, and put together a comprehensive treatment strategy.
