



CREDENTIALING

WITH THE

CANADIAN ACADEMY OF PAIN

MANAGEMENT

Credentialing is a mark of approval by the professional association CAPM that the member has achieved recommended standards of professional development and experience in pain management.

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Be a member of CAPM Credentialing Stream.
2. CV demonstrating two (2) or more years of practice that includes pain management.
3. Reference letters from three (3) of your peers supporting your pain management work.
4. Copy of your highest academic degree/certificate for your profession.
5. Copy of your current license from your regulatory body.
6. Fee for taking the pain credentialing course and sitting the exam.
7. There are provisions for recredentialing every four (4) years.

NOTE:

If you are a credentialed member of the American Academy of Pain Management and you are a member of the CAPM credentialing stream, this can be counted as qualifying for CAPM recredentialing, after providing your credentialing documentation, and the above documentation needed by CAPM.
